

WORDS FROM OUR SHEPHERD!

Last weekend was my first experience with snow in Medina County. It was very impressive to say the least. Even though Fr. Don Oleksiak had all the Masses, he told me that the numbers of people attending was definitely decreased because of the winter storm named “Harper.” Before we all start running to Confession because we missed Mass, be assured that God would rather that we not risk our safety to attend.



A parishioner commented to me recently that they have not seen any changes since I became pastor. As a newly installed pastor we are asked to basically sit back the first year and observe the rhythm of the parish and how things operate. Because of this request by the Bishop and leaders of the diocese I have tried not to change many things.

Before I started as the pastor, I found out at the Easter Vigil that there was a hole in the roof and that the roof needed to be replaced. The Finance Council will be giving an update about this project in the near future.

Other things that have happened since I arrived here are: hired a new PSR Director, Bridget Kovalik, soon after I started because the previous one resigned. Instituted 2-3 more Masses throughout the week. Started Eucharistic Adoration back up beginning Monday morning after the 8am until before the 8am mass on Tuesday. To help protect the people at Adoration during the night hours I have had the two doors on the Ridge Road side of the church equipped with a magnetic locking system with a keypad to unlock these doors. This will be instituted in the very near future. Also, members of the finance and pastoral council and myself are looking into replacing the church sign. As soon as we receive a few design types that the councils and I agree on, we will place those designs in the vestibule for input from you.

Last but not least, members of the parish staff are working on the new web site for the parish. It is a work in progress, so keep checking. The address is: www.olghinckley.org.

I would like to thank you very much for your prayers, cards and gifts for me during my illness. I am slowly getting back to full strength. Unfortunately I still need my right knee replaced. Hopefully that will happen in the near future.

OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS

St. Sulpicius Severus - Sulpicius Severus was born in Aquitaine, Gaul, around the year 360. He was born into a noble family, had an excellent education and became an eloquent lawyer.

He married the daughter of a wealthy consul, but this seemingly happy life changed when his young wife died leaving him no children. Saddened, he turned for consolation to a life of piety and he later followed his friend, St. Paulinus of Nola, into the monastic life. This change of life displeased Sulpicius' father, but his mother-in-law encouraged him. He became a priest, but did not attain a higher rank in the clergy (although he is sometimes confused with another St. Sulpicius Severus who was Bishop of Bourges in the sixth century).

Along with St. Paulinus, Sulpicius was a close friend of St. Martin of Tours, and used his literary skills to write a biography of St. Martin. His other writings included a history of monasticism which had recently been introduced in Gaul. His scholarly works reveal the ideas and influences of St. Martin.

In his later years, Sulpicius was said to have been led away from Church doctrine by Pelagianism, but discovering his error, to have later repented and inflicted long lasting penances on himself. St. Sulpicius Severus died around 420. His memorial is January 29.
