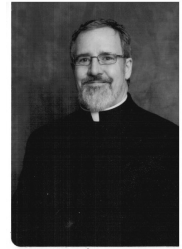

OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS

Pope St. John I — A native of Siena, Italy, Pope John I was Pope from 523 to 526. At that time the former Roman Empire was divided into the Western Empire with the capital in Ravenna and the Eastern or Byzantine Empire with its capital in Constantinople. The Northern tribes, the Ostrogoths, had swarmed into Italy, and by the sixth century the inhabitants were a mix of Roman, barbarian and Christian. The ruler was Theodoric the Goth who favored Arianism due to the fact that the teachings of the Council of Nicea and the rejection of Arianism by Constantinople had not reached north of Italy.

When the Catholic Byzantine Emperor Justin issued an edict in 523 that all Arian churches be turned over to the Catholic Church, Theodoric took the decree to mean surrendering authority to Constantinople. At first he threatened to wage war against Justin, but then decided to negotiate with the Emperor. To this end he sent a delegation to Constantinople. At the head of the delegation was Pope John who did not want the task, but reluctantly agreed to follow Theodoric's wishes. Along with five bishops and four senators Pope John journeyed to Constantinople where he was warmly received by Emperor Justin. Although he would not approve of heresy, Pope John may have asked Justin to moderate his actions against the Arians in order to avoid reprisals against Catholics in Italy. However, Theodoric had suspicions that Pope John had conspired with Justin, and when Pope John returned to Ravenna, Theodoric had him arrested and imprisoned. A frail man, Pope John soon died in prison from neglect and mistreatment on May 18, 526. His body was transferred to Rome and buried in the Basilica of St. Peter. His memorial is May 18.
