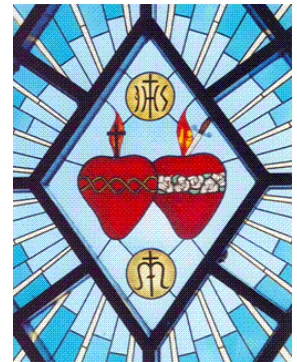

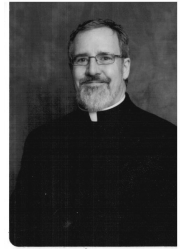

Therefore, to keep all our bins we need to make sure we recycle at least 2,000 lbs. per bin. So please continue to use the bins for all your paper and cardboard recycling. **OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS**

*St. Nunzio Sulprizio* - St. Nunzio Sulprizio was born on April 13, 1817 in Pescara, Italy. When he was 3, Nunzio's father died, and for financial reasons, his mother remarried an older man who held Nunzio in contempt. When she died in 1823, Nunzio went to live with his maternal grandmother who, although illiterate, taught Nunzio to be strong in his faith. At that time children had to wait until age 15 to receive first Holy Communion, but Nunzio attended Mass faithfully where he came to know Jesus.

When his grandmother died a few years later, Nunzio went to live with his maternal uncle, who made him work as an apprentice in his blacksmith shop. His uncle treated him harshly, made him do work that was too hard for him, and beat him or deprived him of food if he did not like how Nunzio did the work. One day when Nunzio returned from an errand, he had a burning fever and swollen leg. The next day he could not stand, but his uncle was indifferent to his suffering. He was later diagnosed as having gangrene and was hospitalized where he patiently offered his pain to God. In 1832 his paternal uncle who was a soldier, introduced him to another soldier, Col. Wochinger who became like a father to him and paid for his medical care. He was very happy to receive his First Communion during this time and his condition would sometimes improve for a while. However, doctors had to amputate his leg in 1835, and in March, 1836 his condition worsened. Through it all he would continue to offer his suffering to God. On May 5, 1836 he asked for a crucifix and received the sacraments before he died at age 19. He was canonized on October 14, 2018 by Pope Francis during the Synod of Bishops on Youth. His memorial is May 5.
