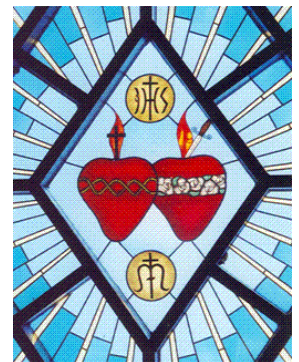

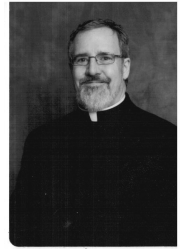

OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS

Blessed Franz Jägerstätter - Franz Jägerstätter was born in St. Radegund, Upper Austria on May 20, 1907. His father, Franz Bachmeier was killed during World War I, and his mother, Rosalia married a local farmer, Heinrich Jägerstätter who adopted Franz. As a youth, Franz was unruly and was the first in his village to own a motorcycle. After working for three years in the iron ore industry, Franz returned to St. Radegund where he became a farmer, and in 1936 he married Franziska with whom he had three daughters. He worked at his parish as the sacristan, attended daily Mass and had a ministry to the bereaved.

In 1938 Germany annexed Austria. Franz was the only one in his village to oppose the annexation. In 1939 he was drafted into the Austrian army but received a deferment. He was called to serve again in 1940, but at the request of the town's mayor was allowed to return home. Called again, he was in active service from October of 1940 to April of 1941 until with the mayor's intervention was once again allowed him to return to his farm. Franz became increasingly convinced that the war Nazi Germany was waging was unjust, and as he grew closer to God his conscience told him that participation in the war was a serious sin. When he was called up again in 1943 to serve in the military he refused to fight but requested non-violent duties. His request was denied and Franz was arrested, tried, and condemned to death for sedition. Choosing to obey God rather than bow to Hitler, Franz was executed on August 9, 1943.

On June 1, 2007 Pope Benedict issued a decree of martyrdom and beatified Franz Jägerstätter on October 26, 2007. His memorial is June 7.
