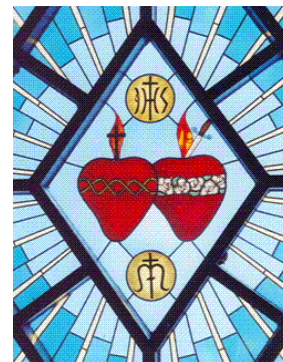

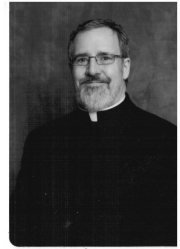

**OUR FRIENDS THE SAINTS**

*St. Methodius of Constantinople* -Methodius was born in Sicily in the late 700's. He went to Constantinople to seek a position in the Court, but influence by a monk, he entered religious life, and built a monastery on the island of Chinos. Methodius was soon asked by the Patriarch Nicephorus of Constantinople to help in the diocese. At that time, 815, there broke out in the Eastern Church a second persecution (the first having been 27 years earlier) of those who opposed iconoclasm. ( An iconoclast opposed the veneration of sacred images.) Nicephorus, loyal to the Church, was deposed and banished by the iconoclast Emperor Leo V. Methodius went to Rome to report the matter to Pope Paschal I.

Methodius stayed in Rome until the death of Leo V. He hoped the situation would change for the better with the new Emperor, Michael II, and delivered a letter from the Pope asking that Nicephorus be restored as Patriarch, but things only got worse. The emperor had Methodius scourged and imprisoned. Released seven years later, Methodius again defended veneration of holy images under the next Emperor, Theophilus who conducted the last and fiercest persecution. Scourged and imprisoned again, Methodius escaped and once more faced Theophilus who eventually mitigated the persecution. When Theophilus died in 842, his wife, Theodora, who was an image venerator in secret, became regent for her infant son. Those who had been imprisoned for opposing the heresy were set free. Methodius became patriarch of Constantinople and enforced once again the decrees of the Second Council of Nicaea. On February 19, 842, the sacred images were brought back to the churches in a solemn procession. This event is still celebrated in the Byzantine Church today as the "Feast of Orthodoxy".

Methodius died in 847. His memorial is June 14.
